AN EXPLANATION OF THE TABLE FOR MARDEN CEMETERY

Marden Cemetery is situated in Maidstone Road. It had been used since 1932 when the churchyard became full, although ashes are still buried at the church. It is divided into four parts with a circle in the centre.

To view the Cemetery database point to TABLES and click CEMETERY.

The database will appear as a series of records. An asterisk in each of the green column headings denote whether that field is searchable, and clicking on each one arranges contents ascending or descending - signified by an upward or downward pointing triangle respectively.

The Search Bar will accept any names, dates or terms and has options for entering multiple terms. The page selection buttons will move through pages of batched records - one page up or down, or to the beginning and end of the whole database or selection. There are also options to export data to Word or Excel files.

To view an individual record, click the magnifying glass button on the extreme right hand side of each one. P

The column names of a record's table are:

- Column 1 Ref No (*) this is a unique number generated by our website's system and has no relevance to the real world.
- Column 2 Entry no (*) this is the record number within the Parish Council/Burial Board records and is the one that should be quoted to them in case of any enquiry.
- Column 3 Section (*) this indicates the Section within the Cemetery where the grave will be found (explanations and plans are on the Parish Council website). These records are incomplete at the moment.

- Column 4 Grave No (*) this indicates the number of the grave, within the Section indicated (explanations and plans are on the Parish Council website). These records are incomplete at the moment.
- Column 5 Surname (*) self-explanatory.
- Column 6 Forename (*) self-explanatory.
- > Column 7 Age(*) age at death.
- Column 8 Date Death (*) self-explanatory.
- Column 9 Date Burial (*) self-explanatory.
- Column 10 Place Death (*) self-explanatory.
- > Column 11 Residence (*) where the person was living.
- Column 12 Grave type (*) this is the size of the grave and the number of persons it is intended for. Sometimes doubles are purchased with one space left for another person who is still alive. A blank means that nothing is noted on the Parish records.
- > Column 13 Entry by (*) the name of the Parish Clerk.
- Column 14 Minister (*) the name of the person who performed the burial service.
- Column 15 Other (*) any other information given; it could be their occupation or status.
- Column 16 P clicking on this will show you the individual record.
- Column 17 Z for editors only.
- Column 18 hor editors only.
- Clicking on this symbol at the top of the page enables you to

print the information as an Excel file.

- Clicking on this symbol at the top of the page enables you to print the information as a Word file.
- Clicking on this symbol at the top of the page enables you to print the information as an Excel CSV file (comma separated values).
